Community Based Response to All-Hazards Threats in Tribal Communities



COURSE OVERVIEW

The purpose of this management level, instructor-led course is to provide tribal nations with the knowledge, skills and abilities necessary to effectively detect, respond to, manage and mitigate all-hazard threats using a whole community approach. This course will include a practical exercise designed specifically to meet the needs of tribal communities.

FINAL EXERCISE

Participants will utilize a practical exercise to: identify all-hazards threats in tribal communities; identify community resources for all-hazards emergency planning in tribal communities; and describe response and recovery considerations that should be included in tribal all-hazards emergency plans.

TARGET AUDIENCE

Target audience will be tribal community representatives and other officials from emergency management, public health, law enforcement, fire, cooperative extension, medical services, environmental health, veterinarians and other animal health officials.
