Small Animal Coughlin Professor

Matt Read, DVM, MVSc, DACVA

Dr. Read is originally from Calgary, and attended veterinary college at the Western College of Veterinary Medicine in Saskatoon, SK. Following completion of his DVM with distinction (1998), he stayed on at the WCVM as a resident in veterinary anesthesiology (2001). Dr. Read successfully completed his specialty certification in anesthesia (2002), becoming a Diplomate of the American College of Veterinary Anesthesiologists.



Following his residency, Dr. Read joined the Department of Small Animal Medicine and Surgery at the University of Georgia from 2001 to 2003. In 2003, Dr. Read entered private practice in Toronto as the staff anesthesiologist at the Veterinary Emergency Clinic. In 2005, Dr. Read moved back home to Calgary where he joined the Western Veterinary Specialist and Emergency Centre to develop their anesthesia service.

He received the Hill’s Outstanding Resident Award and the Stan Olson Award for Clinical Teaching at the Western College of Veterinary Medicine in 2001, and the Veterinarian Appreciation Award from the Alberta Association of Animal Health Technologists in 2007. Dr. Read is both an adjunct professor with the faculty of veterinary medicine at the University of Calgary, as well as with the School of Veterinary Medicine, St. Matthew’s University, Grand Cayman, B.W.I.

UTCVM Distinguished Coughlin Professor

Karen Tobias, DVM, MS, DACVS

Dr. Karen Tobias is a professor of small animal soft tissue surgery at the University of Tennessee College of Veterinary Medicine. She received her doctor of veterinary medicine degree from the University of Illinois. After an internship at Purdue University, she completed a surgery residency and master’s degree at Ohio State University. Following her clinical instructorship at the University of Georgia, she taught for nine years at Washington State University. For the past 10 years, Dr. Tobias has been teaching and performing small animal soft tissue surgeries at the University of Tennessee Veterinary Teaching Hospital.



Dr. Tobias has published more than 100 scientific articles and book chapters and is known nationally and internationally for her work on liver shunts in dogs. Dr. Tobias lives in Knoxville with her husband, two children, two dogs and two cats.

Distinguished Coughlin Professor

**George E. Moore, DVM, MS, PhD
Dipl. ACVIM (SAIM), ACVPM (Epi)**



After graduating from the first class at the University of Tennessee’s College of Veterinary Medicine, Dr. Moore spent more than 22 years in the U.S. Army Veterinary Corps. He had various assignments, culminating in positions as Director of the Department of Defense Military Working Dog Veterinary Services, at Lackland Air Force Base in San Antonio, TX. Dr. Moore completed a residency in small animal internal medicine and a master’s degree in physiology at the University of Georgia. He also earned his Ph.D. in clinical epidemiology from Purdue University. He is board-certified in the specialty of small animal internal medicine in the American College of Veterinary Internal Medicine, and the specialty of epidemiology in the American College of Veterinary Preventive Medicine.

Dr. Moore is currently an associate professor at Purdue University’s School of Veterinary Medicine in West Lafayette, Indiana, is the section head for Epidemiology and Public Health and also serves as the director for clinical trials at Purdue’s Veterinary Teaching Hospital. His research interests include companion animal diseases and evidence-based medicine. He currently serves on editorial review boards of the Journal of Veterinary Internal Medicine, the Journal of the American Animal Hospital Association and Veterinary Therapeutics.

Large Animal Coughlin Professor

David E Anderson, DVM, MS, DACVS



Dr. Anderson was raised in North Carolina in the small farming town of Oak Ridge. He earned both a BS degree in animal science and a DVM from North Carolina State University. He then completed an intensive rotating internship in large animal medicine and surgery at the University of Georgia and a residency in food animal medicine, surgery and reproduction at Kansas State University. Dr. Anderson became a board-certified specialist in surgery (Diplomate ACVS) in 1995. While at Kansas State University, he earned an MS degree in clinical sciences, focusing on bone physiology and fracture repair.

Currently, Dr. Anderson is head of Agricultural Practices at K-State and continues development of novel surgical treatments of injuries that limit welfare and productive use of livestock. His research focus is in surgery of food animals, with special emphasis on pain and welfare. In 2009, Dr. Anderson founded the International Academy of Farm Animal Surgery to provide a method for international exchange of information among veterinarians. The IAFAS has more than 300 participants in 19 different countries.

Dr. Michelle Henry Barton received her DVM from the University of Illinois in 1985 and completed an internship at North Carolina State University in 1986. She completed a residency in large animal medicine at the University of Georgia in 1990. She has remained at the University of Georgia and is now professor in the veterinary medicine college’s department of large animal medicine. She received her Ph.D. in 1990. She has been recognized as the Fuller E. Callaway Endowed Chair and Josiah Meigs Distinguished Teaching Professor. She has authored numerous refereed scientific articles and book chapters. She has served on many editorial boards and has presented at numerous scientific meetings. She has also received many teaching awards during her tenure at the University of Georgia College of Veterinary Medicine.
